

ASK THE LAWYER



Dear Bob,

I am querying agents about my first mystery. Can I also enter it in competitions, or will that cause problems? It seems to me that I have to try every means of getting published, but could that cause a problem down the line?

Dear Reader,

I have limited experience with competitions, but I assume that most if not all competitions arrange for publication of the winning entries.

If that is true, then participating in a competition would indeed cause problems for your agent. Publishers want exclusive rights to publish your book, and if your participation in a competition means you cannot give the publisher exclusive rights, the publisher will not purchase your book, and your agent will be very, very unhappy with you.

I'd hold off from the competition while your book is under consideration by the agent.
